Let's end the divide.

The National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP) provides lifesaving cancer screenings in low-income communities, but less than 2 in 10 eligible people received breast or cervical cancer screenings through this critical safety net—creating a divide in access to cancer prevention and treatment. Increased funding for the NBCCEDP can help ensure more individuals get the care they need from the program and may even save states money on treatment costs by detecting cancer at earlier stages. Prioritize health: Increase funding for the NBCCEDP.
