

83rd Texas Legislative Session - Priority Issues

Tobacco Control

- **Smoke-Free Legislation:** Lead the effort to pass comprehensive smoke-free workplace legislation that protects all workers in Texas.
- **Tobacco Control Programs:** Increase funding to \$3 per capita to expand the state's comprehensive, statewide tobacco prevention and cessation program.

Cancer Research and Prevention Funding

- Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT): Work to secure \$600 million in funding for the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas.
- **Texas Breast and Cervical Cancer Program:** Advocate for \$5.2 million in funding for screening of atrisk women in Texas.
- Texas Cancer Registry: Fully fund the registry's two-year budget.

Ensuring Access to Quality Care

- **Medicaid Coverage:** Defend funding and monitor efforts to reform the state Medicaid program, which provides access to cancer care for the state's low-income population.
- **Medicaid Expansion:** Work with the legislature and healthcare access coalitions to expand access to the Medicaid program.
- Affordable Care Act: Work with state agencies to support implementation of the federal exchange.

Obesity, Physical Activity, and Nutrition Legislation

- **Physical Exercise and Education Requirements:** Work to increase weekly physical education requirements and strengthen curriculum for physical education.
- **Obesity Control Program Funding:** Support the funding request of the TX Department of Health and Human Services for community-based obesity prevention programs.

Youth Tanning Restrictions

• Support legislation to prohibit use of indoor tanning beds for youth under 18 years of age.

Improving Survivors Quality of Life

 Support legislation that educates patients and the medical community on the importance of pain management.
