



Medi-Cal Promise Campaign

The biggest determining factor on whether someone lives or dies after a cancer diagnosis is whether or not they have health insurance. In fact, studies have shown that after a cancer diagnosis, those without insurance are 60% more likely to die than those with insurance.

There are more than 13 million Californians who rely on Medi-Cal for their health coverage. Health insurance is the biggest determining factor on whether someone lives or dies from the disease after a cancer diagnosis. The Medi-Cal population in California faces a higher risk for cancer than the population at large. Loss of coverage for those relying on Medi-Cal would be particularly devastating and would increase the cancer burden in California.

Will you commit to opposing any legislation that the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) shows will result in loss of coverage for the Medi-Cal population?
