Travel to Albany - There will be buses from several points, please check the bus schedule in this manual to see which bus will be closest to you. Those coming from the Capital District will be reimbursed for parking. If you elect to drive yourself even though there is a bus available coming from your area, there will be no reimbursement.

10am - 10:30am - Check-in

When you arrive in Albany you will go through security and head to The Well of the Legislative Office Building. You will pick up your packet and t-shirts.

10:30am-11:20am – Event Kick-off and Speaker Program

Once your bus arrives at the Empire State Plaza Concourse, you will head to the Legislative Office Building through security. Travel lightly as to avoid hold ups going through security. Do not bring weapons of any kind, pocketknives included.

11:30am – 4:00pm – Meetings with Elected Officials

You will be given your schedule in a packet handed out when you arrive at the registration table for the event in The Well. There will be coffee, tea, water and grab and go snacks provided upon your arrival. Boxed lunches will be provided.

4:00-4:30pm – Cancer Action Day Debrief

We will all gather back at The Well to share final thoughts on the day.

4:30pm - Head back to buses

5pm - Buses leave Albany

You will board the buses from Madison Avenue on the other end of the concourse where you were dropped off in the morning.



Background

During our virtual training, we will go in-depth about biomarker testing, what the asks are and why we are asking our lawmakers to support the legislation to expand access to biomarker testing in New York State. Here are a few key points.

Biomarkers: a characteristic that is objectively measured and evaluated as an indicator of normal biological processes, pathogenic processes, or pharmacologic responses to a specific therapeutic intervention. Includes *gene mutations* or *protein expression*.

The right treatment, at the right time

- An essential component of precision medicine
- Targeted cancer therapy
- •Avoidance of therapies unlikely to provide clinical benefit

Not just about cancer

•Being explored in a variety of disease areas (e.g., cardiology, rheumatology, neurology, infectious, respiratory, autoimmune diseases)

Ask #1

Will you support and co-sponsor A1673/S1196 which will ensure New Yorkers covered by state-regulated insurance plans, including Medicaid, have coverage for biomarker testing when medically appropriate.

Ask #2

All state legislators, policymakers and staff are invited to join Assemblymember Pamela Hunter, Senator Roxanne Persaud, and ACS CAN for a Legislative Breakfast on Wednesday April 26 from 8:30am-10am in Room 711A of the LOB to learn about biomarker testing from a panel of experts and discuss the proposed legislation.

While every lawmaker has already been invited, please remind them and encourage them and their staff to attend.

Navigating the Capitol

CHECK-IN

Check-in will begin at 10 AM, Tuesday, April 25 in The Well of the LOB. There will be greeters to help you find your way from the bus drop-off or parking lot. You will receive your T-shirt, packet which will include a map and schedule of the day plus pertinent information you will need. You will be given leave behind packets to give your legislators during your meeting.

SECURITY

Upon entering the LOB from the Concourse, you will have to go through security. I suggest traveling light because you will have everything scanned including yourself. Be sure to bring your ID. Once in the LOB you can move back and forth between the LOB and Capitol Building. If you go outside or on the concourse, you will have to get back in through security.

WHAT TO SEE ON THE PLAZA

If you have extra time, here are a few things to do connected to the Empire Plaza or concourse. <u>New York State Museum</u> Memorials on the Plaza Plaza Art Collection Corning Tower Observation Deck Vietnam Memorial Gallery New York State Capitol Tours Need a coffee or a snack? I suggest the Dunkin Donuts in the Capitol Building so

you do not have to go in and out of security.

PARKING

There are two parking garages that are easily accessible to the Empire State Plaza. You can park in the visitor's lot P-3 under the Empire State Plaza. The cost for parking is a \$10 flat fee, card payments only, cash is NOT accepted. There is also the MVP Arena parking garage which is adjacent to the Empire State Plaza and accessed via the walkway that connects the plaza to the garage. The cost is \$8 per day. Please save your receipt to submit for reimbursement if traveling from the Capital Region.
