The pandemic also exposed entrenched health disparities that exist in communities across the country.

- The 5-year relative survival rate is lower among Blacks/African-Americans than Whites for every stage of diagnosis in the four most common cancer sites.
- Studies show that individuals from the poorest U.S. counties have a 20% higher cancer death rate than affluent counties.

As our tools to detect and treat cancer advance, we must also increase our efforts to ensure that everyone has a fair and just opportunity to prevent, detect, treat, and survive cancer.
