

FY23 Appropriations Asks: By the Numbers

ASK #1: Will you support increased funding for cancer research and prevention programs in fiscal year 2023 with at least \$49 billion for the National Institutes of Health (NIH), including \$7.7 billion for cancer research at the National Cancer Institute (NCI)?

ASK #2: Will you support \$462.6 million for Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) cancer programs, including \$225 million for the National Breast & Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP)?

The Numbers

Please note that it is not necessary to share these numbers with your lawmakers. We are providing them as background for folks who are interested. Your story and your connection to cancer research and prevention program funding are the most important parts of your meetings on lobby day.

National Institutes of Health (NIH)

FY22 Enacted: \$44.959 B

ACS CAN ASK: \$49 B (\$4.1 B increase)

House Bill: \$47.459 B (\$2.5 B increase)

Senate Bill: \$46.959 B (\$2.0 B increase)

National Cancer Institute (NCI)

FY22 Enacted: \$6.913 B

ACS CAN ASK: \$7.766 B (\$853 million increase)

House bill: \$7.379 B (\$466 million increase)

Senate bill: \$7.203 B (\$290 million increase)

Centers for Disease Control (CDC) Cancer Programs

FY22 Enacted: \$389.8 M

ACS CAN ASK: \$462.6 M (\$72.8 M increase)

House bill: \$429.5 M (\$39.7 M increase)

Senate bill: \$420.0 M (\$30.2 M increase)

National Breast & Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP)

FY22 Enacted: \$196.9 M

ACS CAN ASK: \$225.0 M (\$28.1 M increase)

House bill: \$206.9 M (\$10.0 M increase)

Senate bill: \$206.9 M (\$10.0 M increase)
