



Vice State Lead Ambassador Partnership Agreement

Term: The term for a Vice State Lead Ambassador is two years with the expectation of promotion to the SLA position for an additional two-year term.

Time Commitment: This is a year-round position. The time commitment will vary from month-to-month depending on the status of state and federal legislative campaigns.

Based on discussion with the staff partner, the anticipated time commitment for this position is expected to be approximately _____ hours per month.

Responsibilities:

Outreach to Federal and State Elected Officials

1. Participate in state lobby days.
2. Participate in meetings and communicate with federal and state level elected officials as needed.

Recruiting and Cultivating Volunteers

1. Assist the SLA in ensuring legislative needs are met throughout the state; this may require filling gaps in the structure.
2. Provide additional support to the SLA as needed.

Managing and Mentoring the ACT Lead(s)

1. Assist in hosting state-based ACT Lead meetings to provide information and set goals.
2. Assist in hosting monthly ACT Lead calls to provide information pertaining to fundraising, policy, recruitment, upcoming activities, and highlighting work within the state.

Serving as a Spokesperson for ACS CAN

1. Speak on behalf of ACS CAN at media events and in radio/TV interviews.
2. Submit letters to the editor on ACS CAN issues and activities.
3. Represent ACS CAN at American Cancer Society events including Relay For Life and Making Strides Against Breast Cancer, and at other events in the community as needed.

Training and Personal Development

1. Participate in quarterly national All Lead Calls.
2. Participate in Cancer Votes training and issue specific training as needed.
