Survey Methodology

TargetSmart designed this multi-modal survey administered via live phone calls and email-solicited online interviews.

The survey reached 813 adults, age 18 or older, who indicated that they were registered to vote in New Jersey. The overall margin of error is +/-4.0% and as weighted the survey sample is representative of all registered voters in the state of New Jersey.

The survey was conducted from October 14 to 19, 2021.






6-in-10 support permanently prohibiting indoor smoking in NJ casinos




Q.10 And do you support or oppose permanently prohibiting indoor smoking at all casinos in New Jersey?


Q.11 Supporters of prohibiting indoor smoking at NJ casinos say more than 22,000 casino employees in NJ are exposed to dangerous secondhand smoke each day at their workplace. For nearly a year during the pandemic, a temporary ban on smoking in casinos meant that casino workers and patrons could breathe fresh air while working in and gaming at NJ's casinos. During this time NJ casinos thrived, even while smoking was prohibited.

Opponents of prohibiting indoor smoking at NJ casinos say it will hurt the casino industry in NJ which has already been battered by closures and a massive number of layoffs. They say banning smoking will lead to fewer customers and fewer jobs at a time when the economy is already hurting. Banning smoking now while the NJ economy is just recovering is irresponsible and will mean fewer NJ citizens have access to family-supporting jobs.




