Yet, in the face of these crises, our recent ACS CAN California Ambassador Summit, **Together We Thrive: Building Hope and CommUnity**, served as a powerful reminder of the magic that happens when we unite as a community. We honored newly retired leader Jim Knox's 20 years of ACS CAN service and welcomed Laura LaRose as our new Vice SLA. We celebrated and recognized a handful of volunteers who went above and beyond this year, and we were inspired by 10-year-old junior ambassadors Michael Reinhart and Lorenzo Escoto. Nearly 200 volunteers and staff—from seasoned advocates with decades of ACS CAN wisdom to a growing number of passionate youth—came together, each bringing their unique talents and perspectives. The uplifting energy throughout the day was palpable, as we reflected on how, together, we can leverage our individual strengths to build a stronger community and contribute to ending cancer as we know it, for everyone.

2025 CALIFORNIA LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

State Priorities One-Pager

2025 Cancer Action Day Priorities

- 1. **AB 573 (Rogers) CDTFA Tobacco Retail License Fee** A bill to increase the tobacco retail licensing fee to expand reach of annual inspections and increase capacity to seize illegal flavored tobacco from stores.
- 2. **AB 957 (Ortega) Tobacco Free Pharmacies** A bill to end the sale of cigarettes or tobacco products in pharmacies.
- 3. AB 703 (Lee) Childhood Cancer Research Tax Checkoff- A bill to initiate a

Childhood Cancer Research Fund through voluntary tax contributions.
