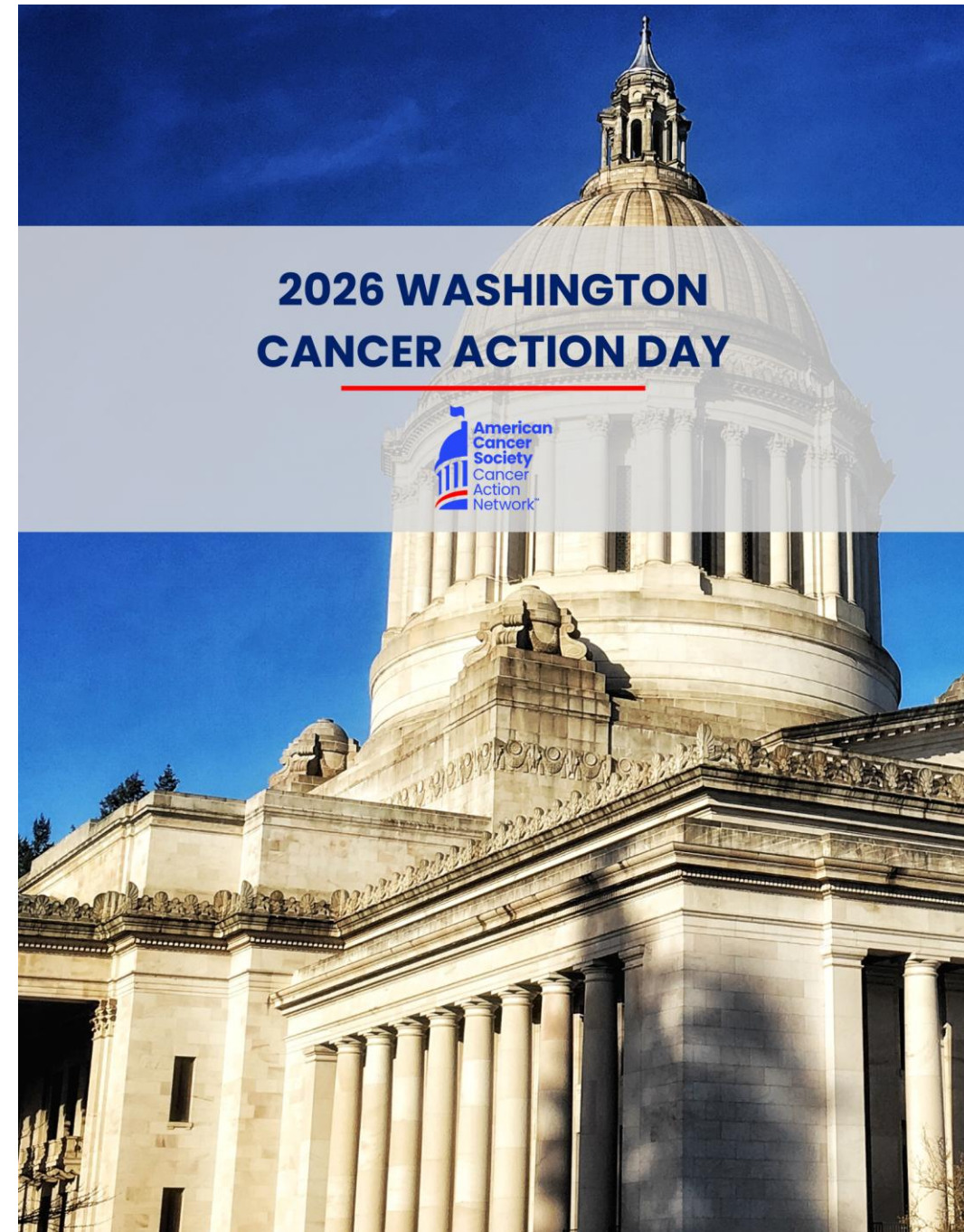


What is Cancer Action Day?

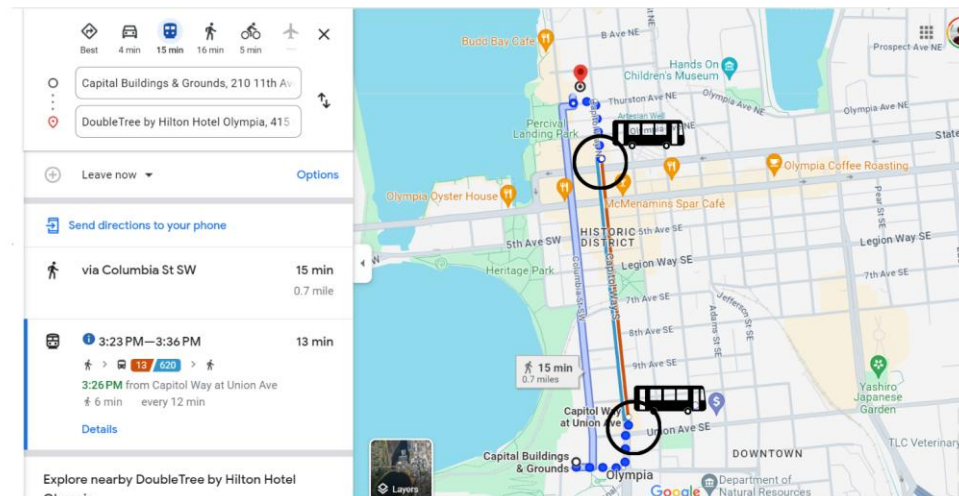

- Take DASH Bus to Capitol Campus, stop at 11th Ave & Capitol Way, Bus is FREE

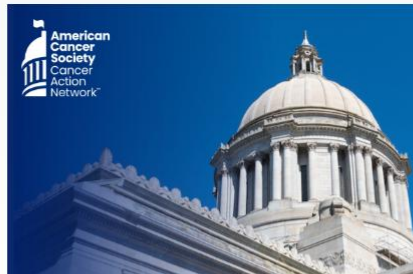

Legislative Asks for Cancer Action Day

Connect Your Story to Legislative Asks

1. **Tobacco Control** & Prevention Funding
 - Increase the cigarette tax by **at least \$2 per pack**
 - **Restore funding** to the Tobacco Prevention and Cessation Program with the cigarette tax **at \$10mil/year**
2. Reduce Patient Medical Debt: **Support SB 5993** & prohibit interest on new medical debt
3. **No cuts to Medicaid/Apple Health Eligibility & Cascade Care**
4. **Coverage for Biomarker Testing – Support HB 1062**

3. Will you pledge to support no cuts to Medicaid/Apple Health Eligibility & Cascade Care?
4. Will you support HB 1062 and access to biomarker testing?

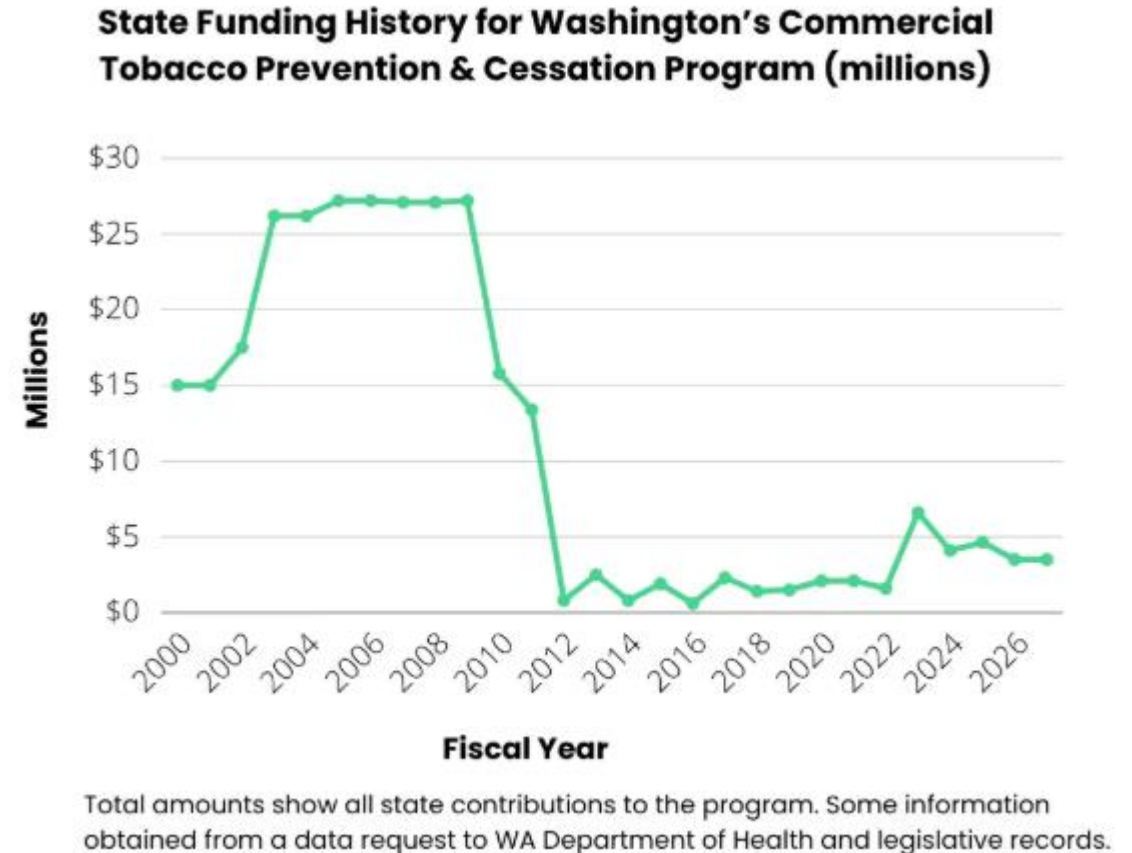

Legislative Asks for Cancer Action Day: **Top Data Points #1**

Tobacco Taxes & Prevention Funding

- Increasing tobacco taxes significantly is the most effective way to help people quit & prevent people from ever starting
- Tobacco directly costs Washington \$3.26B in healthcare expenditures
- By increasing the cigarette tax, WA could restore dedicated funding to the tobacco prevention and cessation program



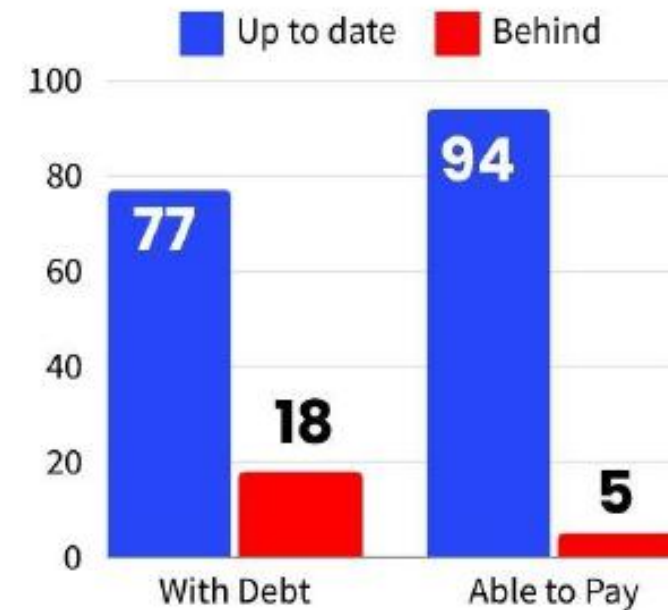

Legislative Asks for Cancer Action Day: **Top Data Points #2**

Medical Debt: Prohibiting Interest

- Nearly 47% of cancer patients and survivors surveyed by ACS CAN have had medical debt related to their cancer
- Those with cancer related medical debt are **three times** more likely to be behind on recommended cancer screenings
- 98% of patients surveyed had health coverage at the time they accumulated the debt

Those with cancer debt are more than 3x as likely to be behind on screenings

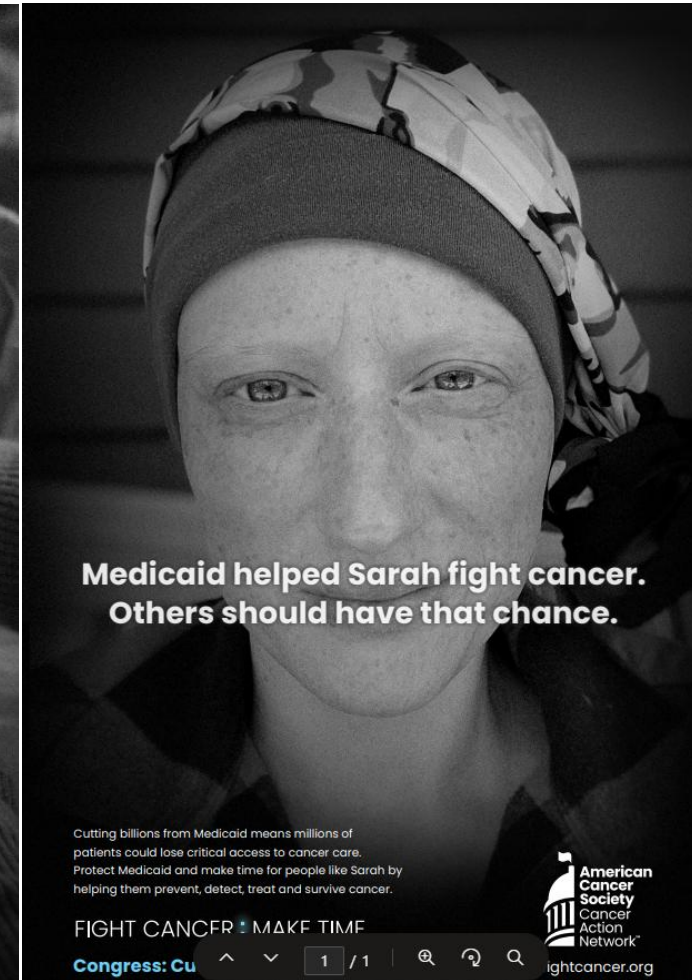

Legislative Asks for Cancer Action Day: **Top Data Points #3**

Medicaid/Apple Health Eligibility & Cascade Care

- 1 in 10 people with a history of cancer rely on Medicaid for their health coverage
- Late-stage cancer costs are up to 7 times higher than the costs to treat earlier-stage cancer
- 1 in 3 children diagnosed with cancer were found to be enrolled in Medicaid at the time

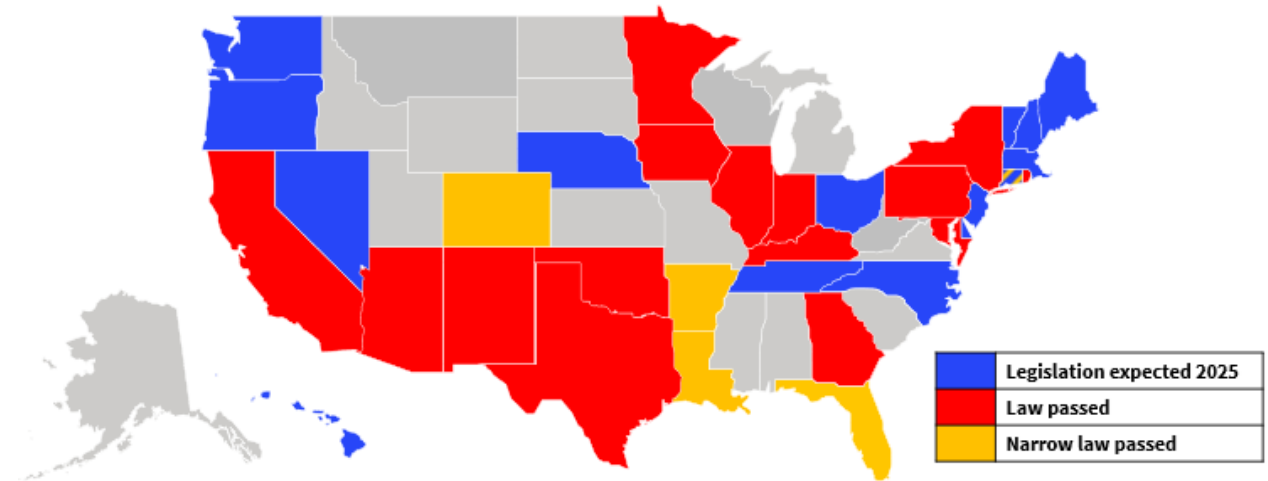

Legislative Asks for Cancer Action Day: **Top Data Points #4**

Biomarker Testing Coverage

- Timely access to comprehensive biomarker testing coverage can increase outcomes, improve quality of life & reduce costs
- Nearly 60% of all cancer drugs approved in the last 5 years require or recommend biomarker testing before use
- Research shows that people of color – particularly Black people – are not benefitting from biomarker testing at the same rates that whites are

Connect Your Story to Legislative Asks

- Connect your personal story, to our legislative asks to create a powerful message of advocacy for cancer patients, their caregivers and families.

The power of Storytelling

The power of Story Telling

Connecting your person stories to our asks:

- Connect your personal story, to our legislative asks to create a powerful message of advocacy for cancer patients, their caregivers and families.
- **Example for an ask:** *“Hello representative, I’m here today to talk about increasing the tobacco tax in our state. My mother was a lifelong smoker and impacted by lung cancer. By increasing the tax, we can prevent others from experiencing the same burden of cancer.”*

Your stories helps us:

- **Guide Policy Priorities:** *Your experience reveals gaps. Maybe you struggled to access treatment, navigate insurance, or find support. These insights help lawmakers identify where systems are failing.*
- **Drive urgency:** *Personal testimony can be the tipping point that moves a bill forward or secures critical funding.*
- **Shapes legislation:** *Personal stories have led to increased research funding, expanded screening programs, and better patient protections.*

The American Cancer Society exists because the burden of cancer is unacceptably high.
